

Antibody Screening Now Available at 10 Sites Across South Shore

New and existing patients of Mount Sinai South Nassau may now access antibody screening blood tests at a number of Mount Sinai South Nassau's ambulatory locations.

You do not need a previous positive COVID-19 test to qualify for antibody testing at these locations. The presence of COVID-19 antibodies in your system is an indication that you PROBABLY WERE EXPOSED TO the virus, even if you did not have any symptoms and that you may have some degree of immunity to the virus, but this is not proven as of yet. A negative antibody test does not guarantee that you were not exposed.

The antibody tests being administered by Mount Sinai South Nassau are authorized by the FDA and have a high degree of reliability.

If you have developed antibodies to the virus, you may be eligible to help others by donating antibody-rich plasma at the New York Blood Center. The plasma can be used to help treat COVID positive patients who are currently fighting the virus.

Critical Care Unit to Reopen – 'Don't Put Your Health on Hold'



Don't Allow Fear of COVID-19 to Keep You from Scheduling Your Physical

As Mount Sinai South Nassau's outpatient medical offices begin to ramp up for health screenings, you may be wondering if it's safe to schedule an appointment. Your safety and well-being are the hospital's top priority. To that end, Mount Sinai South Nassau is following CDC guidelines to ensure social distancing and has implemented several initiatives to enhance patient safety in its outpatient medical practices:

- All patients are pre-screened for COVID-19 symptoms over the phone when they schedule and confirm their appointment
- Exam rooms are sanitized after each patient visit
- Proper face masks are required for all staff and patients. (Masks will be provided to patients who need them)
- Paperwork can be completed electronically prior to the visit
- Additional lag time is scheduled between appointments
- Patients do not wait in the waiting room, but are brought directly to the exam room

Please be aware that scheduling an appointment may take longer than usual due to social distancing requirements.

County Executive, Police Commissioner, Bagpipers and Drummers Salute Front Line Workers

Nassau County Executive Laura Curran, Police Commissioner Patrick Ryder, bagpipers and drummers from the Nassau County Police Department and a caravan of emergency vehicles paraded past Mount Sinai South Nassau yesterday to honor the hospital's heroes fighting on the front lines of the pandemic. Hospital employees lined up outside the entrance to the hospital, cheering and applauding in appreciation for the high-level salute.

Curran and Ryder also thanked the MSSN Emergency Department and Intensive Care Unit staffs for helping to save the life of a Nassau County police officer who was brought to the ED in March in cardiac arrest (unrelated to COVID). "From the bottom of our hearts, The Nassau County Police Department thanks all of you for what you have done for our members over the last several weeks," Commissioner Ryder told MSSN workers who greeted PD representatives outside the hospital on Wednesday. "One of our officers was taken in here...he had collapsed in the station house. It was critical for first couple of days ...the work that was done in here in the Emergency Room and in the ICU is what saved our officer's life so we want to say thank you to all of you."

"Thank you for what you have been doing, getting us through the surge. I know it wasn't easy. I know we were right up against it but we made it through," said Curran. "Your grit and your tenacity and your professionalism makes me so optimistic that we will come back stronger, we will come back smarter and we will come back better."
