REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

Interested firms are invited to prequalify for the opportunity to participate in the Request for Proposal (RFP) process for a Pre-Fabrication / Modular Construction of a New Central Utility Plant (CUP) at South Nassau Communities Hospital (SNCH) located at One Healthy Way in Oceanside, NY. The proposed project will be a 2 story, 21,000 SF Building where the CUP will be housed. The CUP will include new Mechanical, Electrical, Fire Protection, Plumbing components and structural ability to support a façade, furnished & installed by others.

The qualification and response period will begin Monday, January 15, 2018. **Qualification Packages are due 2:00 PM ET February 14, 2018.**

Following the prequalification period, qualified firms will then be issued a formal RFP. SOUTH NASSAU COMMUNITIES HOSPITAL encourages all small business, minority owned firms, veteran owned firms, and women's business enterprises to participate.
