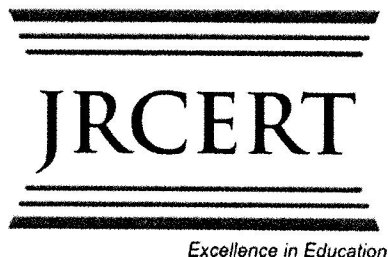

An interim report will be required. The projected date for submission of the interim report is the First Quarter of 2026. The JRCERT will provide program officials adequate notice of the due date for submission of the interim report. Based on the interim report, the JRCERT will determine if the accreditation award of eight years will be maintained or reduced and the continuing accreditation process expedited.

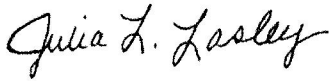
If the accreditation award is maintained, the next site visit is tentatively scheduled for the First Quarter of 2030.
